A group of 14 local teens from Girls Inc. of Carpinteria had a once-in-a-lifetime trip to Washington, D.C., last week.

The young ladies had a packed schedule in the nation's capital, meeting local representatives and senators, including Congresswoman Lois Capps and senators Barbara Boxer and Dianne Feinstein, to discuss youth mentoring, grants, STEM legislation, and immigration.
