LETTER FROM OUR LEADERS

Welcome to our annual impact report where we share with you the influence our programs have had this past fiscal year, highlight our supporters, and provide a little insight into what we do for the youth we serve. This year we are celebrating our 50th year in Carpinteria! For the past 50 years Girls Inc. of Carpinteria has had the privilege to help guide our girls to be strong, smart, and bold women. We are grateful to our community and the support shown to Girls Inc. the past 50 years and this past year is no exception. 2020-2021 truly spotlights that our programs are sustainable, our girls are resilient, and our community is thriving- our work makes a difference for our girls and future generations.

We started this fiscal year 4 weeks into serving 50 girls in-person during a global pandemic. Knowing the critical importance of affordable, quality care while families navigated the effects of COVID on our community, Girls Inc. of Carpinteria was the first out of school program to open its doors and we made sure our programs were accessible to any girl and family that needed help during this unprecedented time. Flash forward to the end of August we made the BOLD decision to keep our program open full day (8am-5pm) to support girls in distance learning, guide them as they navigated the trauma and toxic stressors they were facing, and ensure they were engaged in hands-on activities to ignite their passions. From there our programs continued to adapt and adjust to meet the needs of the school district. We showed the community just how STRONG we arewe never once stopped serving our girls and their families. We continued with the programming we offered pre-pandemic and we grew our programs to enhance access for our girls to STRONG, SMART, and BOLD initiatives through our new sports, STEM, and advocacy programs.

We did a lot of SMART work as a board and organization as well. We continued to invest in our staff through trainings and strategic goals to ensure they are prepared for the trauma informed work they do every day. We scenario planned for the best and prepared for the worst. Our team remained resilient, and the board and community is grateful for the professional manner in which they handled themselves as they served our girls. We regularly discuss the future and opportunities to continue to grow the impact our programming has in our communities. We have much to be proud of and we were only successful because of each dedicated supporter. Whether you are a trustee, donor, volunteer, staff, alumna, current girl, or her family, thank you! Girls Inc. of Carpinteria thrived this past year because of you.



During a typical year Girls Inc. serves more than 1000, youth.



OUR PROGRAMS

Our intentional, compensatory program offerings fill the gaps for our local schools and are designed to meet the needs of the community. We focus on 3 core essential services (healthy living, academic support & enrichment, and life skills instruction) with age-appropriate and relevant information that is interactive, inclusive, and culturally appropriate to reach our designed outcomes.

Out-of-School Programs

Girls Inc. out-of-school programs provide a safe, accessible, and pro-girl environment for our families, on our Foothill Campus. We are open when the schools are closed and provide homework support, enrichment, literacy, STEM and sports programming.

Outreach Programs

Girls Inc. is proud to work with our local schools and have a 25 year standing relationship. We partner to provide professionally trained staff to supplement the school day through our literacy, healthy sexuality, and mentorship programs on school campuses across Carpinteria and Santa Paula.

Girls were served through our new STRONG program. The program exposed girls K-12 to a variety of sports giving them the tools needed to live balanced lives.




The Avantor Foundation STEM




INCOME


