Girls Inc. was founded in Carpinteria in 1971 as a summer camp for 33 girls. The club incorporated in 1974, began year-round programming in 1975, purchased a two-bedroom house in 1978, and affiliated with Girls Clubs of America in 1982. In 1990, Girls Club changed its name to Girls Incorporated and our affiliate followed suit.

In 1994, Girls Inc. of Carpinteria began a \$2.4 million capital campaign resulting in the building of a 16,000 square foot facility, which tripled its programming capacity.

At Girls Inc. of Carpinteria, our commitment to empowering girls through our Strong, Smart, and Bold programming extends beyond individual development and supports the broader community. We understand that true support for youth involves strengthening the families and neighborhoods around them, which is why we've adopted a holistic approach to building resilience. This year, our focus on fostering a resilient community has been demonstrated through our Community Food Pantry, Resilience Hub, and Sustainability Initiatives.

COMMUNITY FOOD PANTRY: With rising costs along the Central Coast, many families, including those in our programs, have faced financial strains. To help, we established a 24/7 Community Food Pantry, rescuing and redistributing over 100,000 pounds of food in the past year—a 37% increase from the previous year. Our pantry offers fresh, refrigerated, and frozen foods, ensuring individuals and families have access to the nutrition they need. We also provide nutritional snacks and light meals to youth, especially during school breaks, bridging the gap for those who may lack consistent access to nutritious food outside school hours.

RESILIENCE HUB: Girls Inc. of Carpinteria was designated as one of three Resilience Hubs in Santa Barbara County by the Santa Barbara County Regional Climate Collaborative, highlighting our key role in emergency response and preparedness. We've partnered with the County Sustainability Department and the Office of Emergency Management to strengthen our community's resilience to natural disasters like fires, floods, and heatwaves. Over the past year, we've invested significantly in resources and training to enhance our emergency readiness.

SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVES: Our commitment to sustainability is evident in our environmental stewardship and education efforts. This year, we installed low-flow water systems and transitioned to solar power, reducing our ecological footprint. In partnership with the Carpinteria Lion's Club, we introduced the Lions Butterfly Garden, an educational space that promotes conversations about sustainability and the environment. This garden serves as a hands-on learning tool, fostering a deeper appreciation for ecological responsibility among our girls.

Through these initiatives, we are not only addressing immediate needs but also building a stronger, more resilient, and sustainable community for the future generation of leaders.


